#### Granting observer access to BelV tot the TRM meetings of ParticiaWP1 Basic data acquisition

- BeIV is the TSO that supports the Belgian regulator FANC in the licensing process of MYRRHA. In that role it would be useful to grant access to BeIV to the TRM meetings as an observer (for information purposes).
- In this proposal, the access is subject to signing the same NDA agreement as is in use for the IAG members.
- Furthermore, the access proposal is specifically limited to BeIV as the TSO connected to the licensing of MYRRHA as this is the system being investigated in the project.

### **Russian participation in PATRICIA**

- Several partners have indicated difficulties with collaborating in the PATRICIA project because of the conflict in Ukraine, because of the position their institute or government has taken with towards continuation collaboration with Russian institutes. It is clear that these positions have immediate impact on the project.
- After contacting the EU commissioner on March 8th, no clear position was taken by the EU with regard to Russian or Belarusian beneficiaries. The reply received on March 9<sup>th</sup> states "We are currently waiting for central instructions and specific guidelines on how to proceed with the Russian beneficiaries."
- Because of the urgency of the issue, the coordinator and GOV chair, took the decision to suspend the collaboration with the Russian partner IPPE in the project up to the Governing board meeting of March 31<sup>st</sup> 2022.
- The question posed to the Govening board is how to proceed with the collaboration with IPPE.
